

**MINUTES/OVERVIEW
SPECIAL BOARD MEETING/PUBLIC MEETING
MARCH 25, 2006**

The Special Board meeting of the City of Weatherby Lake Board of Aldermen was called to order by Mayor Mike Henderson, on Saturday, March 25, 2006 at City Hall, 7200 N.W. Eastside Drive, Weatherby Lake, Platte County, Missouri at 2:00 P.M.

Aldermen present were: Cummings, Moratz, Clark and Rittenhouse.

Also present were Chief Gary McMullin and thirteen (13) members of the public.

Discussion turned to the status of HB209 and the need to anticipate compliance with the upcoming Missouri Supreme Court decision. Cummings moved, second by Clark to pass Resolution NO. 032506. Yeas: Moratz, Rittenhouse, Clark and Cummings.

Resolution NO. 032506, a resolution directing compliance with Section 92.086.6 of HB209 passed in 20025 by promulgating and publishing the rate of taxation for telephone services under Article II Sections 600.190-600.250 of the Weatherby Lake Code.

Mayor Henderson opens the floor to begin the public information meeting previously called. Mayor Henderson gives an overview of the upcoming ballot questions relating the proposed change in the levy ceiling. Examples included the shortages in the road and street fund, the limited revenues the City received from the county re-assessment (\$9000.00) approximately, budget cuts made for 2005, staffing changes etc.

Alderman Cummings explains that the questions reflected on the ballot would raise the "cap" set on the general fund levy by the state auditor's office from the current .70 cents per hundred to 1.00 per hundred. This would allow the City some flexibility when setting the levy each August. Funds derived would be available for use in the general fund.

Alderman Rittenhouse notes that the City is currently part of three (3) road districts. Funding from each is limited in scope and dollar amounts. With no control/questioning of the amount by the City.

Alderman Moratz stepped forward to give specific examples of budget revenues and budget expenses to those in attendance.

Mr. Tom Laughlin asked what the % of revenue the real estate and personal property tax generate?

Mr. Neil Brown asked a series of questions relating to the proposed ambulance district and how such a district would affect the level of property tax to residents.

Mr. Gene Roberts asked if the City had explored its ability to opt in or out of the road districts. Mayor Henderson responded that this might be an issue that the Northland Mayor's Council should explore.

Rittenhouse moved, second by Clark to adjourn. Yeas: Cummings, Moratz, Clark and Rittenhouse. Motion passed unanimously.
